## GILSLAND AGRICULTURAL SOCIETY EQUESTRIAN SHOW RULES AND REGULATIONS

- ◆ Judging will commence at 10:00 when a continuous programme of events will follow. **Ring A, B, C, D and E will run concurrently. Plan your classes accordingly.**
- ◆ The same equine may be entered in more than one class, where eligible, on payment of the entry fee for each class. Every exhibit must be the bona fide property of the exhibitor at the time of the entry and continue to be so up to and including the day of the show.
- ◆ The Show Committee reserves the right to cancel or combine any classes if it has insufficient entries or if there are exceptional circumstances.
- ◆ **All Champions must take part in the Supreme Championship otherwise they will forfeit their prize money. All Trophies and Special Rosettes to be presented at this time.**
- ◆ Judging will commence, as near as circumstances allow, at the times stated in the schedule under the respective sectional headings and exhibitors will be held responsible for their exhibits being in the judging ring at the proper time.
- ◆ A Judge may withhold any prize or prizes if, in his/her opinion, an exhibit is of insufficient merit. The decision of the Judges will in all cases be final. In the event of any Judge being unable to complete the judging of the classes for which he/she is officiating the Show Secretary will appoint a Deputy Judge whose decision will be final.
- ◆ Society and Committee Members may exhibit providing that no badges or any form of identification are shown.
- ◆ The Show Committees reserve the right, due to exceptional circumstances, to appoint additional or substitute judges after the publication of the original appointments given in the Schedule.
- ◆ An exhibitor winning one or more of the Society's Trophies is required to return the same in good condition on demand and not less than prior to the commencement of the Show in the following year.
- ◆ All objections must be made in writing and lodged with the Show Secretary within 1 hour of the completion of the appropriate class. The objector must at the same time lodge the sum of £20.00 in the hands of the Show Secretary, and this deposit shall be forfeit if the Show Committee considers the objection to be frivolous. If the protest is sustained any prize money awarded to the exhibitor shall be forfeited and the matter dealt with as the Society or its duly authorised Show Committee shall determine and the deposit returned to the objector.
- ◆ All exhibitors and their servants shall be governed by the rules and regulations of the society as interpreted by the Stewards and Officials and in the event of any dispute the Society reserves to itself or its duly authorised Show Committee the sole and absolute right to settle arbitrarily and determine on all matters, questions or differences in regard thereto or otherwise arising out of or connected with or incidental to the Show.
- ◆ The Society, or its duly authorised Show Committee, or its Officials shall not be responsible for any accident, damage or loss however caused that may occur to any exhibitor or his servants, or to any animal, article or property brought into the Showground, or while entering or leaving or being carried into or out of the Showground. Each exhibitor shall be solely responsible for any loss, injury or damage that may be done to, or occasioned by, or arising from any animal, article or property exhibited or brought onto the Showground by him/her and he/she shall indemnify and hold harmless the Society from and against all actions, suit, expenses and claims on account of or in respect of any such damage or injury which may be caused or occasioned.
- ◆ In accordance with the Health and Safety Legislation's all equestrian exhibitors/competitors/grooms must now comply with the above. Total separation between equines and the general public may in certain instances be impossible and it is suggested that if any exhibitor has a nervous/highly strung equine he/she should consider whether it is prudent for him/her to risk bringing this animal to the showground. Children should not be allowed to handle any large or fractious animal. An adult should always be in attendance to take over if a child is having difficulty maintaining control of any animal.
- ◆ The Gilsland Agricultural Society and the Show Committee requires that correctly secured British Standard skull caps/riding hats or PAS accredited hats **MUST** be worn at all times when mounted.
- ◆ Cantering/Galloping on the Showground other than in class is **FORBIDDEN**.
- ◆ All ridden horses and ponies must be 4 years old and over, and no mare with foal at foot is allowed in ridden classes.
- ◆ No foal allowed on Showground less than 3 weeks of age.
- ◆ In ridden classes no cutting whips or canes exceeding 30".
- ◆ The Show Committee reserves the right for any equine to be measured.
- ◆ All 2019 members of Gilsland Agricultural Society are eligible to attend the AGM in January 2020
- ◆ **GENERAL DATA PROTECTION REGULATION (GDPR)**- By signing the entry form, exhibitors accept that we will share their data, if necessary, with the bodies and breed societies listed below. Data will be published in our Show Programme, and be on the Society's website and Facebook pages and given to the local press with regards to the Show's results. - ◆ **Late entries will be taken on the day at a cost of £12.00 per class**
- ◆ **FLU VACCINATIONS**  
*Horses must have been vaccinated to comply with the requirements of the primary course (1st vaccine & then 2nd vaccination 21-92 days later) followed by the first booster (150-215 days) and all subsequent boosters. Horses may compete having received the primary course & prior to the first booster but not within 7 days of receiving a vaccine dose. Horses must have been vaccinated within 6 months before the show but not less than 7 days of arriving at the show.*  
*FOALS -In foal mares that have already had vaccinations of primary equine influenza course should be vaccinated 4-6 weeks before the foal is due to be born. Foals should be vaccinated for equine influenza at 6 months to commence their primary course.*  
**PLEASE NOTE NEITHER VACCINATION CERTIFICATES NOR PASSPORTS SHOULD BE SENT TO THE SHOW OFFICE PRIOR TO THE EVENT. HOWEVER, RANDOM CHECKS WILL BE CARRIED OUT ON THE SHOWGROUND DURING THE SHOW.**

### **THE SHOWING REGISTER INFORMATION**

**TSR Showing Finals** – This show is a qualifier for the TSR Showing Finals. Qualify and enter ANY of the Finals Central, East Anglia, North West, North East, South East, South, Wales & South West or Scottish. You Do Not have to be a TSR member to qualify or enter a final. The Rider/Handler qualifies and can enter any horse/pony in any number of Finals!

**TSR Riders Finals** – 1st & 2nd riders qualify and will receive a qualification card in the ring.

**TSR In Hand Finals** – The two highest placed Handlers with a TSR In Hand Card will qualify in any In Hand class. Handlers MUST have their cards signed in the ring by the judge/steward, cards are available FREE from the TSR website. Full details at <http://www.theshowingregister.co.uk/>

**TSR Medal Awards** – TSR members can collect qualification cards & signatures and redeem for a TSR Medal see TSR website for details.

### **Horse & Country Racehorses (HCR) INFORMATION**

The Horse & Country Racehorses (HCR) series is open to Thoroughbreds who have raced, trained or been bred to race. Racing injuries will be ignored providing the horse is sound. Riders must be 14 years plus, ridden horses must be 4 years plus and veterans are 12 years plus. Judges will not ride and you will not be asked to gallop as a ride but maybe asked to gallop in your individual show. To qualify for the championships at the Grand Slam at Inghliston in September 2019, the handler/rider **and** horse must be registered with HCR, you must carry your cards in the ring for signing and be placed 1st--4<sup>th</sup> (qualifications *may* be passed down to 6<sup>th</sup> place). Non---members must send their qualification cards (presented by the judge), fees and register with HCR no later than 14 days after this show **and** before the closing date for entries for the Grand Slam.

(All Entries Must Be Registered with the S.P.S.B.S. State Registration No to Breed Society on Entry Form.

Production of Passport may be required on Showday.)

- Classes must be confined to Registered Ponies. Ponies must be named on the entry form and in the catalogue if one is produced. Society rosettes must only be given to ponies registered with the Society or eligible for registration (i.e. foals)
- Three-year-old fillies with foals at foot may not be shown. All foals must be a minimum of three weeks old on the day of the Show. All entire males aged 2 years and over must display a stallion disc.
- There must be no colts or entire males in Young Handlers classes. Children under 14 yrs old may not show colts (excluding foals) or entire males in In-hand classes. Children under 12 yrs old on the day of the show may not show entire males in ridden classes. In the interests of safety, hard hats must be worn by all handlers aged 14 yrs or under in In-hand classes. Exhibitors should not kneel but remain standing while in the ring. Hard hats must be worn by all exhibitors, irrespective of age, in ridden classes. In ridden Classes, if a rider falls off at any time whilst in the ring, both pony and rider must leave the ring, rider dismounted, and take no further part.
